

AUDIO-GUIDE VISITS OF THE ANCOEUR VALLEY

The Seine-et-Marne General Council, in partnership with Seine-et-Marne Tourisme, is happy to invite you to discover the richness of the Ancoeur Valley through three audio-guide circuits. In this way you can visit the castle of Blandy-les-Tours, its village and the Saint-Martin collegial in Champeaux.

Below you will find practical information that will be useful in planning your arrival as well as several suggestions for further visits.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION:

Blandy-les-Tours

Access:

From Paris: join the A5 in direction of Troyes, exit n°16 Châtillon-la-Borde, then follow the D47 From Melun: take the D408 then follow the D47, or the N36, then the D215, via Vaux-le-Vicomte

From Provins: take the D408 then follow the D47

Train and Bus:

Melun station: direct trains from Paris, 25 mins

From April to October, on weekends and bank holidays, the Châteaubus shuttle service links Melun station and the castle of Blandy. Details and schedule can be found on www.tourisme77.fr under "Travel"

Opening hours:

10:00 - 12:30 and 13:30 - 18:00 from April 1st to October 31st 10:00 - 12:30 and 13:30 - 17:00 from November 1st to March 31st

Open every day, except Tuesdays. Closed December 25th, January 1st and May 1st

Castle entrance fee:

Full fare: €6

Reduced fare: \in 4 (from 19 to 25 year olds, over 60s and recipients of AAH)

Free for under 18s, the unemployed and recipients of CMU or RSA Groups welcomed upon reservation 48 hours in advance

From Paris: join the A5 in direction of Troyes, exit n°15 Saint-Germain-Laxis, then follow the D57 From Melun: take the D636, then the D215, via Vaux-le-Vicomte From Provins: take the D619, then the D215

Vaux-le-Vicomte Castle

This castle, legendary estate of Nicolas Fouquet built in the 17th century, was accomplished by the greatest artists of the period who went on to participate in the construction of the Palace of Versailles: Louis Le Vau, Charles Le Brun and André Le Nôtre.

Fontainebleau Castle

With over 1500 rooms set in the heart of 130 hectares of parks and gardens, this jewel of the French Renaissance is the only royal and imperial castle to have been continually inhabited for 7 centuries.
